Financial assistance for smoke alarms for deaf or hearing impaired. (info from www.emergency.qld.gov.au)

VISALERT

You might be eligible to receive funding of up to \$400 to help pay for the cost of a special smoke alarm designed for your needs.

There is a limit of one fire alarm subsidy per household and all installation costs must be met by the applicant.

You can choose between a number of types of smoke alarm systems available at several retail outlets.

Applications for rebates must be supported by original proof-of-purchase (please keep a copy of your receipt for your records) and address the eligibility criteria.

To receive assistance, you must live in your own or family home or private rental premises in Queensland and have:

- signed confirmation by a qualified GP or hearing practitioner (at Falls of Sound) recommending suitability for the scheme based on their assessment that your level of hearing loss may prevent you from hearing a standard smoke alarm; OR
- a previous assessment (up to three years from date of application) that you are profoundly deaf;

AND you have one of the following:

- Centrelink Pension Concession Card; OR
- Health Care Card; OR
- a Department of Veteran's Affairs Gold Repatriation Health Card (DVA) issued for all conditions; OR
- a White Repatriation Health Card (DVA) issued for conditions that include hearing loss; OR
- the status of being a dependent of a person in one of the above categories.

You can further support your application by showing:

- you use Auslan or another sign language as your main method of communication; and/or
- a reference from and/or membership of a service, club or social group for people who are deaf or hearing impaired.

You must not live in a place where appropriate smoke alarm systems for people who are deaf or hearing impaired have already been installed in any individual and common areas by the manager or managing body responsible.

Applicants must select a smoke alarm system which includes a photoelectric alarm and a combination of a visual alert (strobe) and a vibrating pad.

Your letter must state your residential address and provide telephone and other relevant contact details such as email address.

Payment of successful applications for the rebate are expected to be made within 60 days.
